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The Jean Monnet Project "Enhancing the Debate about Intercultural Dialogue, EU Values and Diversity" of the University of Macedonia in collaboration with the Jean Monnet Centre of Excellence "European Constitutionalism and Religion(s)" of the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki organized a **Summer Seminar** from the 30<sup>th</sup> of June until the 3<sup>rd</sup> of July entitled "**Challenges for the European Societies**". The summer seminar lasted 27 hours and awarded, after a multiple choice examination, 3 extracurricular ECTs.

The seminar was addressed to a broad audience, including legal practitioners, researchers in EU studies, academics, students of economic, legal and political disciplines, local, regional and national authorities, opinion leaders and the civil society.

The speakers of the seminar were distinguished university professors, academics, researchers, and lawyers.
